Andetag is a visual manifestation of a deep breath, inviting people around the world to breathe in unison. The artworks are sculpted from custom woven textiles, animated with light to illustrate the flow of air through the lungs.

The animation allows the viewer to synchronize their breath with the artwork. Every piece is synchronized via the internet to every other, a global rhythm, gathering the world in one collective breath.



The first edition will contain 50 artworks that will premiere at Art Miami in December 2023, in collaboration with Chase Contemporary.







Imbued is a series of optical fibre textile artworks, connected in real-time, via Wi-Fi, to the blockchain.

Each artwork comes with a set of NFTs, which powers a ritual where people across the world share their emotions on the blockchain itself. These words then drive the changing color and light, flowing through the artworks.

Imbued consists of 7 physical works of art, each connected to 100 digital NFTs. The owners of the NFTs are invited to a digital ritual, where they can express their own feelings of love in words. The words are permanently stored on the blockchain and downloaded in real time, via Wi-Fi, by the physical artwork. These are then used to generate color and light, which flows through the fabric.

The words together form an ongoing interactive poem written by people around the world that can be read on the blockchain.

The jacquard loom is the origin of the modern computer. The threads of the weave, moving up and down, as ones and zeroes. Digitalization and textile production are intricately connected through time.

Historically, a textile was something unique. It was mainly produced in the home, becoming family treasures lasting for generations, through mending, recycling and reuse. Today, textiles are mass produced. The "unique" and "personal" is sold by the yard. Textile has become a fungible commodity, where every piece of fabric has its individuality shaved away to make sure that each inch, each roll is replaceable by another.

The Imbued series is the world's first true Hybrid NFT Artwork. A physical, wall hanging artwork that uses custom woven optical fiber textiles, and digital controllers that connect in real time to the blockchain to display a generative pattern through its fibers.







Emerging Sensation is a series of interactive installations where textile sculptures and Augmented Reality intertwine.

The series draws its theme from the evolution of the earth, the origin of life, the carnal life and death, the unknown, the next generation. Evolution has no goal, no will, yet it controls everything around us. The viewer is invited to take on the role of evolution, the force that has the ability to create or extinguish life.

The installations in Emerging Sensation are linked to Augmented Reality. By touching the installation, the visitor changes both the physical light play in the installation and the 3D animations displayed in the headset.

Emerging Sensation was exhibited in an old nuclear reactor underneath Stockholm City. The exhibition quickly sold out and had over 4000 visitors.



Body is the second installation in the series of Emerging Sensation. The inspiration comes from the bodies we inhabit. Evolution is an ongoing process inside of us. Just like species change and become other species over time, our bodies are in constant change. Cells in our bodies mutate all the time, occasionally they grow stronger and can create tumors. Creating evolution in the making but possibly giving the host a deadly disease in the meantime.

In the augmented reality headset the viewer can partake in the cellular division inside the body. By touching the sculpture, the cells split in half.





Those Who Affected Me is an interactive light emitting textile art installation. Suspended in mid air, over 1,5 meters tall, and 2,5 meter diameter, the four winged structure invites the audience to gently touch the textile and reacts by sending colorful ripples up and down the intricate fabric.

The custom designed jacquard textile is using optical fibers connected to about 500 individually programmable color LEDs, connected to a microcomputer. Thin, electrically conducting copper threads are woven in to create touch sensitive areas inside the fabric. The 11 meters of fabric are mounted with steel rods around a steel cylinder.

The sculpture is exhibited in an small room with tilted mirror walls, creating a distorted universe where the sculpture is multiplied in infinity. The project started off in winter 2015 as an idea of making an interactive fabric.

During the process of creating it, Malin Bobeck thought of it as a self

portrait. -The people around me are affecting me all the time, both mentally, physically and emotionally. The installtion is a reflection of how people affects me as touch affects the installation.

Those Who Affected Me was exhibited at the Gothenburg museum of art, Sweden, December 2015 to February 2016 and the National museum of art, Stockholm, Sweden, September 2016 to January 2016.





Escape to an alternative reality, a tactile world shaped by your touch.

Tactile Refuge is an interactive, light emitting, textile installation in which the viewer is the creator of their environment. The piece consists of six fabric wings, woven with optical fibers that are lit from within, and a hanging centrepiece, hand-tufted and implanted with optical fibers and LEDs. The installation is seemingly floating in a sheltered, dark space.

The centerpiece sculpture is registering human touch and reacts by changing colour. It affects the entire installation and intensifies the immersive light patterns in the fabric of the wings. Collaborating together will make the reaction even stronger, changing the atmosphere of the entire space.

The installation is providing a world with twisted perspectives that allow strangers to share experiences in an open and vulnerable way. It brings together groups of strangers to briefly escape the outside world. By touching the centrepiece of the installation, participants will set off varying light

patterns which ripple around them, coursing through the mounted wings.

Tactile Refuge was commissioned by Heimtextil Frankfurt Fair, Germany, exhibited in January 2017.

It has also been exhibited at Hallwysk Museum in Stockholm, Sweden, February 2017 and in The Node, Sickla, Sweden, during Burning Man Week Stockholm, March 2017.

Malin Bobeck Tadaa is an awarded textile artist based in Stockholm, Sweden. With her self-developed methodology of weaving LEDs, sensors, and electronics, into fabrics, she creates one-of-a-kind artworks. The optical fibers make her art both visual and tactile and invite the visitor to interact and influence it. The audience doesn't just admire her art, they become a part of her installations.

Her art is inspired by the human imagination, deep sea, outer space, and the worlds that are hidden from us. By creating spaces with inspiration from these worlds she gives the viewer an experience of shifted perspectives. She has an array of successful projects and exhibitions behind her.

She has previously exhibited in the Zona Maco - Mexico City, National Museum of Art in Stockholm, Gothenburg Art Museum, Borås Textile Museum, and KTH in Stockholm where her biggest solo show so far, Emerging Sensation, took place in January 2019 and attracted over 4000 visitors and was funded by The Swedish Arts Grants Committee.

"In my art, I explore the human encounter and let it run as an overall theme in my work. I work in textile, one of our most common materials. Textile is security, warmth and protection. Using these properties, I create works of art that invite people to
